Jeelan Bilal-Gore is a visual researcher, curator and TransCultural Exchange's Assistant Director/Research Assistant. Originally from Boston, Jeelan lived in Japan working with a sound artist before pursuing master's degrees in art history and museology at SOAS University of London and Newcastle University. She has fifteen years of experience researching historical and contemporary visual cultures across the world for exhibitions, educational programs and media projects at art organizations in the US and UK. These include the Dallas Museum of Art, Tyne & Wear Archives & Museums and Matt's Gallery London. From 2013 to 2018 she founded and ran the London-based international contemporary art initiative Juncture Project. With her background in art history, cultural heritage and cross-cultural collaboration, Jeelan joined TransCultural Exchange in 2023 to assist with its projects.

CO-HOST, WRITER AND PRODUCER

As a writer, artist, curator, and director of the award-winning TransCultural Exchange, Mary Sherman is a strong advocate for the arts and her fellow artists. For two decades, she served as an art critic for such publications as The Chicago Sun-Times, The Boston Globe, Arts International and ARTnews, among others. In 1989 she founded TransCultural Exchange to foster a greater understanding of world cultures through high-quality global art projects, cultural exchanges and educational programming. In 2010 she was the interim Associate Director of MIT's Program in Art, Culture and Technology and, since 1993, she has been a professor at Boston College. She has delivered papers at numerous conferences and universities, served as an artist-in-residence at such institutions as MIT, Paris' Cité Internationale des Arts, Pilchuk School of Glass and Taipei's Kuandu Museum. She also has received numerous grants and awards, including four Fulbright Specialist Grants. In 2016 her work was the subject of MIT Press/Leonardo Electronic Almanac's Mary Sherman: What If You Could Hear a Painting. Additionally, in 2002 she signed on as a plaintiff in a landmark, class action suit opposing online databases co-opting freelance writers' copyrights without their permission. In 2009 the case was argued in front of the Supreme Court and, finally, settled out of court in 2017.

EDITOR, CAMERA AND TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

Janelle Giuliani is an editor, videographer and Assistant Camera. She has worked on numerous feature films, commercials and corporate projects within the New England area. Janelle attended New England School of Communications within Husson University, where she completed her Bachelor of Science in Video Production with a minor in Graphic Design and a minor in Marketing Communications. She owns Purple Prince Productions, a self-run company, which creates online content and visual marketing for local musical artists.



COMPOSER

Benoit Granier is a Composer, Professor, (ethno) Musicologist, visual and sonic Artist, Philosopher, and lifelong believer in collaborative works within the arts. After completing a Ph.D. in Computer music and composition at Trinity College Dublin, Ireland, he moved to Beijing, China, to teach at central conservatory of Music, and developed strong relationships between China and other countries, mainly in Europe and the USA. In 2008, he founded in Beijing the Timi Modern Music Ensemble, a cultural encounter between western instruments and traditional Chinese instruments. Among the pieces premiered by the Timi were works by emerging composers such as Tony De Ritis, John Mallia and his own personal pieces. His compositions have been widely performed, including at Beijing's Central Conservatory, the Vienna Chamber Orchestra, Shenzhen Orchestra, Ecole des Beaux Arts de Nantes, the Smithsonian, Carnegie Hall, and Harvard University, among others. Currently, he leads the new Music Technology Program at Coventry University.
